Your vote matters! The Ranson and Shepherdstown Municipal Elections will take place on **Tuesday, June 7th**. Polls will be open from **6:30 am to 7:30 pm**. In [Ranson](#), eight candidates are vying for four City Council positions, including two At-Large seats, a First Ward Council Member, and a Second Ward Council Member. Those elected will take office on July 1st and will serve a four-year term. In [Shepherdstown](#), candidates will be elected to serve two-year terms of Mayor, Recorder, and five Council Members.

This is an important opportunity to elect local leaders who share your values to ensure that our county moves in a more sustainable direction. These are the Ranson candidates we support:



Kenneth Suits

Kenneth Suits lives in Briar Run and works at the Hollywood Casino. He believes that the City of Ranson has lacked transparency, and how the Rockwool Factory was developed is an example of this. Reminder: 6/9 Public Hearing on Solar Facilities

The Jefferson County Commission will hold a public hearing on **Thursday, June 9th at 9:30 am** to receive input on the recommendation put forward by the Jefferson County Planning Commission regarding the proposed Solar Energy Facilities zoning ordinance text amendment (File #ZTA22-01). The recommendation includes a principal permitted 'by-right' use designation for large-scale development within the [Urban Growth Boundary](#) and [Preferred Growth Area](#), and a Conditional Use designation for facilities in all other areas of the county. Even though we are happy to see the changes incorporating a Conditional Use process for certain areas, expanding Conditional Use to all zoning districts would be beneficial to the county. This would allow residents to give public input during the decision-making process as each project is evaluated for compatibility within a given area.

We encourage you to attend this hearing and continue to submit public comments (email: info@jeffersoncountywv.org) regarding this zoning amendment and the future of solar development in our county.
